**LEGAL SERVICES CENTER OF HARVARD LAW SCHOOL SEEKS TO
SPONSOR AN APPLICANT FOR PUBLIC INTEREST FELLOWSHIP IN
LOW-INCOME TAXPAYER ADVOCACY**

Tax Law Fellowship Opportunity: The Legal Services Center (LSC) of Harvard Law School seeks to sponsor an applicant for a public interest fellowship in our Federal Tax Clinic. Fellowship possibilities include the Skadden Foundation, Equal Justice Works, Harvard Law School Public Service Venture Fund, and the Christine A. Brunswick Public Service Fellowship of the ABA Section of Taxation; however, we will also consider sponsorship for other fellowship programs. Depending on the fellowship program, third-year law students, recent law school graduates, and judicial law clerks may be eligible to apply.

Candidates should have a demonstrated interest in tax law and in public service. We especially encourage candidates who are interested in designing a fellowship proposal to advocate for low-income veterans with disabilities. To apply, candidates should send an email and resume to Prof. Keith Fogg, Director, Federal Tax Clinic, at kfogg@law.harvard.edu. Candidates will be considered on a rolling basis. Please note that many fellowship programs have submission deadlines in late summer or early fall. Candidates are encouraged to contact us as early as possible.

The Federal Tax Clinic: Formally launched in 2015 as an academic clinic, and preceded by nearly two years of client advocacy as a pro bono initiative, the Federal Tax Clinic represents underserved low-income taxpayers—with a particular focus on low-income veterans and on low-income immigrant communities—in IRS tax controversy matters. Leveraging LSC's community-based location in Boston and LSC's existing network of partnerships with veterans' services providers, financial empowerment programs, and organizations serving nearby communities, we creatively and energetically represent taxpayers in the full range of tax controversies, at both the agency and court levels.

About the Legal Services Center: Located at the crossroads of Jamaica Plain and Roxbury in the City of Boston, we are a community-based clinical law program of Harvard Law School. Through six clinical offerings—Administrative/Disability Law Clinic, Family Law/Domestic Violence Clinic, Predatory Lending/Consumer Protection Clinic, Housing Clinic, Veterans Legal Clinic, and Federal Tax Clinic—and numerous *pro bono* initiatives we provide essential legal services to low-income residents of Greater Boston and in some instances, where cases present important law reform opportunities, to clients outside our service area.
